

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR STORAGE AND DISPOSAL OF PRODUCTS

### Product storage:

- Products must be stored in a dry place, off the ground. The products must not get wet.
- Small bags of mortar are packed on pallets with a binding wrapping around it, covered with a splash protection film. This does not constitute a sufficient weather shelter for storage, so the pallets must be protected by other means, such as a protective cover that is impermeable to water, or stored in a shed.
- Large bags can be stored on pallets, for example, and protected from rain by an impermeable protective cover.
- Liquid products must be protected from freezing conditions.
- The shelf life of the products is indicated on the packaging and on the product card. The date of manufacture of the product is printed on the packaging.
- For products for which no shelf life has been specified, such as sand products, the shelf life of the packaging material must be taken into account. The properties of packaging material begin to deteriorate after one year of storage.

### Disposal instructions for packaging:

- Empty and clean plastic and cardboard packaging can be recycled at collection points or disposed of as energy waste in accordance with local recycling guidelines.
- Metal containers must be brought to metal collection points in accordance with local recycling guidelines.

### Disposal instructions for products:

- Dried mortar products must be disposed of in accordance with local recycling regulations.
- Hazardous products can be identified by the warning labels on the product and by the markings or warnings indicating the dangerousness of the product in the operational safety bulletin. Such a product must be taken to a collection point for hazardous waste. Products without a warning label can be disposed of as mixed waste.
